It's a diverse ward with a variety of needs and concerns and I have learnt a lot by working with residents and assisting them with housing, planning, benefits, crime and community issues.

Never has it been more important to elect to Tandridge District Council someone who will represent you, who will listen, and who is independent and non-political. I have seen the change for the better that OLRG and associated Independent Councillors are making and I want to build on what we have already achieved.

• ACHIEVING 2 HOUR FREE PARKING, in Ellice Road car park after the Conservative administration cut it down to only 1 hour, supporting Oxted's businesses, for example by defeating a large increase in business permit parking charges being proposed for Oxted, preventing inappropriate development, and most importantly, putting residents first. OLRG Councillors took part throughout the Local Plan Examination. Working with our top planning QC funded by residents' donations, we put forward alternative proposals for rewriting the Plan – to deliver infrastructure, to protect the Green Belt, and to provide higher numbers of affordable housing.

• CRIME AND ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR: I very much share your concerns about the amount of crime, especially overt drugs use, about the fear of crime, and about police response times. I am keen to work with the police and the community to try to improve the situation and to encourage and help more residents to set up Neighbourhood Watch schemes in their roads.



• **RE-ELECTING ME** is a vote for an independent, non-political voice who will represent <u>you</u> and who will listen. Together with my fellow OLRG Ward Councillors, Catherine Sayer and David Stamp, I will continue to keep fighting for the interests of residents and local businesses. OLRG Councillors are not afraid to challenge the status quo, and we try to provide transparency and scrutiny at Council meetings.

• BETTER FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY:



The Council now has severe financial difficulties. These were triggered by a failed change project called Customer First brought in by the Conservative administration. It was supposed to save money but has gone millions over budget, with the loss of many experienced staff. In addition, the administration has so far spent around £3 million on its Local Plan, the centrepiece of which is a proposal for 4,000 homes on the Green Belt at South Godstone. The Planning Inspector who is deciding on the Local Plan has now said he has "significant concerns" about this proposal and about the soundness of other key parts of the Plan. He has given the

Council two options - to continue with its Plan or to withdraw it - either will cost a lot more money.

To try to balance the books, other political groups approved a borrowing facility of a massive £200m to buy commercial investment properties - together they outvoted our group of Councillors. In May last year, in the wake of the pandemic, they voted to buy another property for £20m but this time our Councillors managed to halt the purchase after Government warnings about the risk involved. The Council has low financial reserves and buying properties with large loans is risky. I am concerned that these huge loans are underwritten by Council taxpayers who will face cuts to services and/or raised taxes if things go wrong. If re-elected, I will press instead for shared services with other Councils as a way to cut costs and to get better services for residents.

• AN INDEPENDENT VOICE WHO WILL PUT THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY FIRST:

OLRG has 7 Councillors who are linked in the Council with 6 other Independents from around Tandridge District. I strongly believe that Independent Councillors - who are not told what to do by a political party - are the only way to ensure the community is always put first. My only allegiance is to the community and not to party politics. Tandridge is now a "hung" Council with no group in overall control. If just a few more OLRG/ Independents are elected on May 6th, we will become the largest group and be able to have a much stronger voice for residents. If you want the community's voice to be heard strongly, please do vote for me and the OLRG team.
